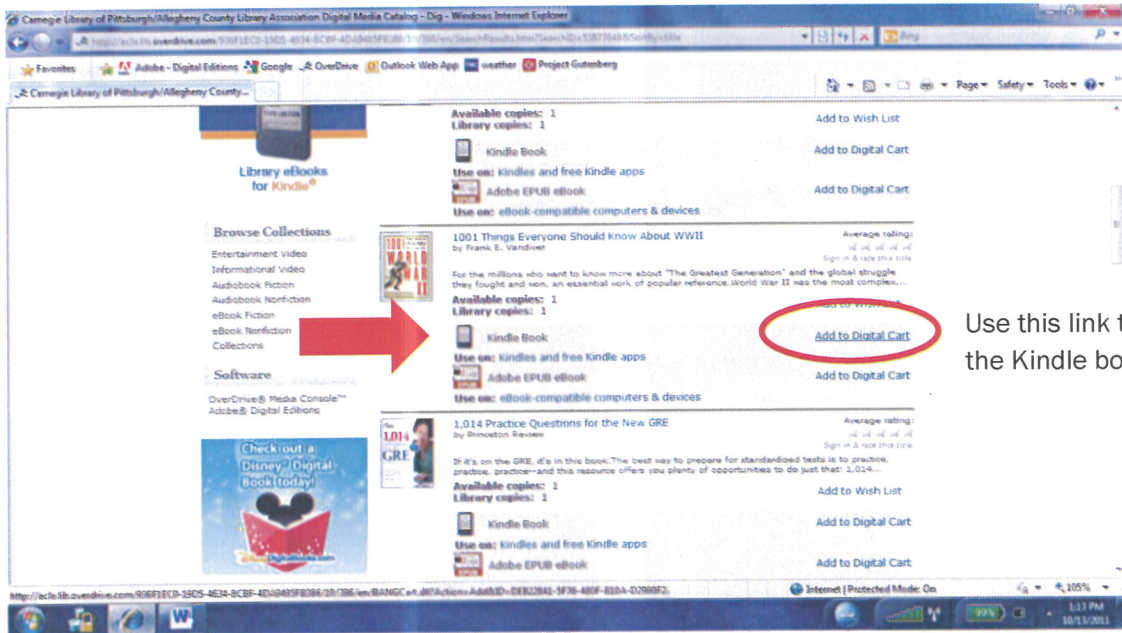


## Checking out OverDrive Kindle Books

In order to use your Kindle to download library eBooks, you will need to have your Kindle registered to an Amazon account (registration instructions are included below). Once you select a title, you will be transferred to [www.amazon.com](http://www.amazon.com) to download the eBook. Library eBooks can then be delivered to your Kindle device either through a Wi-Fi network or through your Kindle's USB cable from your computer. The eBooks will not transfer to your Kindle on its 3G network.

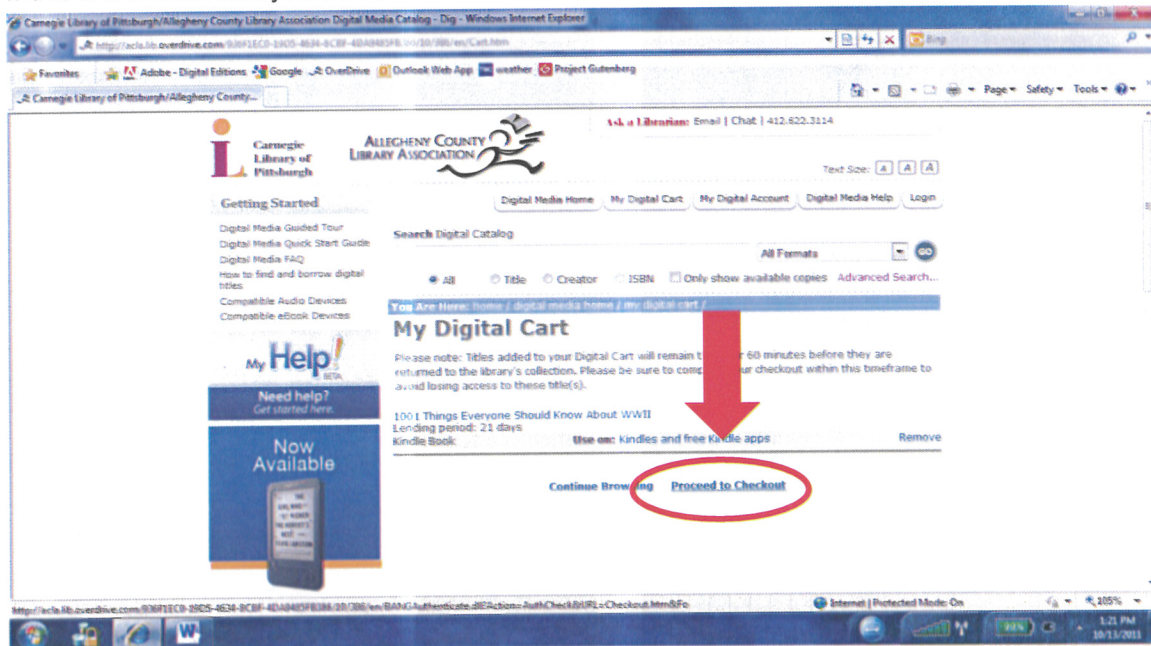
On a computer, find the book that you want on our OverDrive site at <http://acla.lib.overdrive.com>. (On the Kindle Fire this can be done through the built-in browser.) Click on the "Add to Digital Cart" link to the right of the Kindle icon.



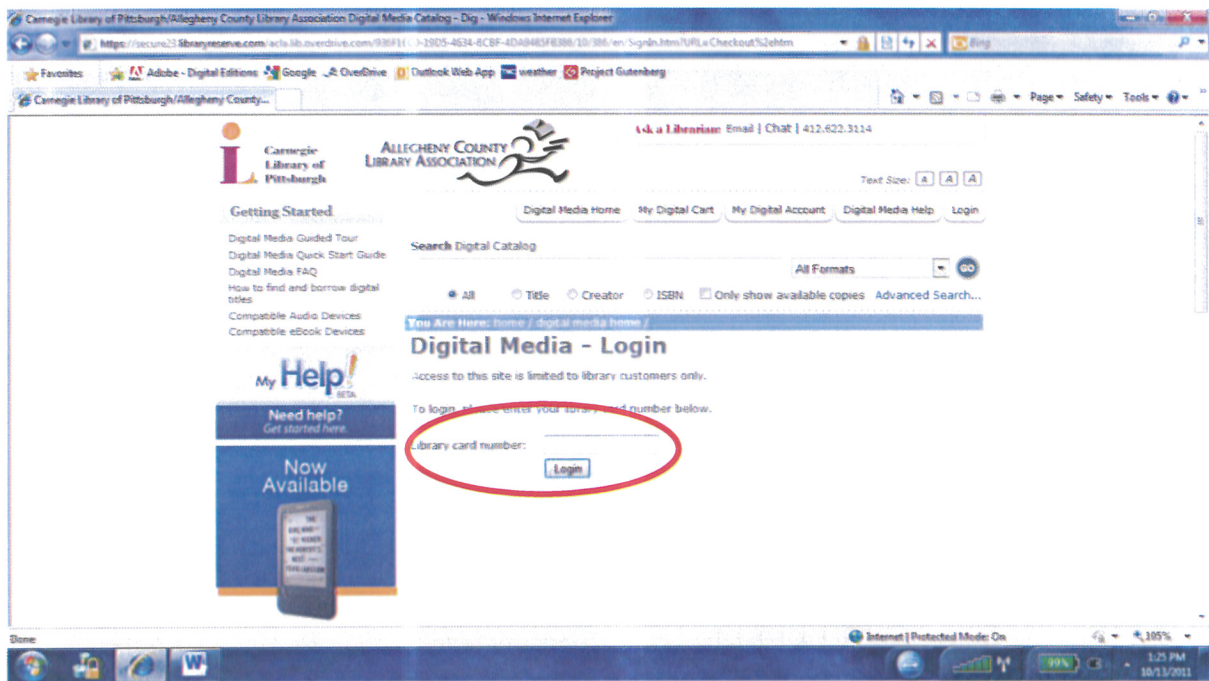
Use this link to select the Kindle book.

Once you click the "Add to Digital Cart" link, you will be taken to your digital cart. You'll be able to see that you've selected a Kindle book. You also have the option to remove this book from your cart if you have selected the wrong title or format.

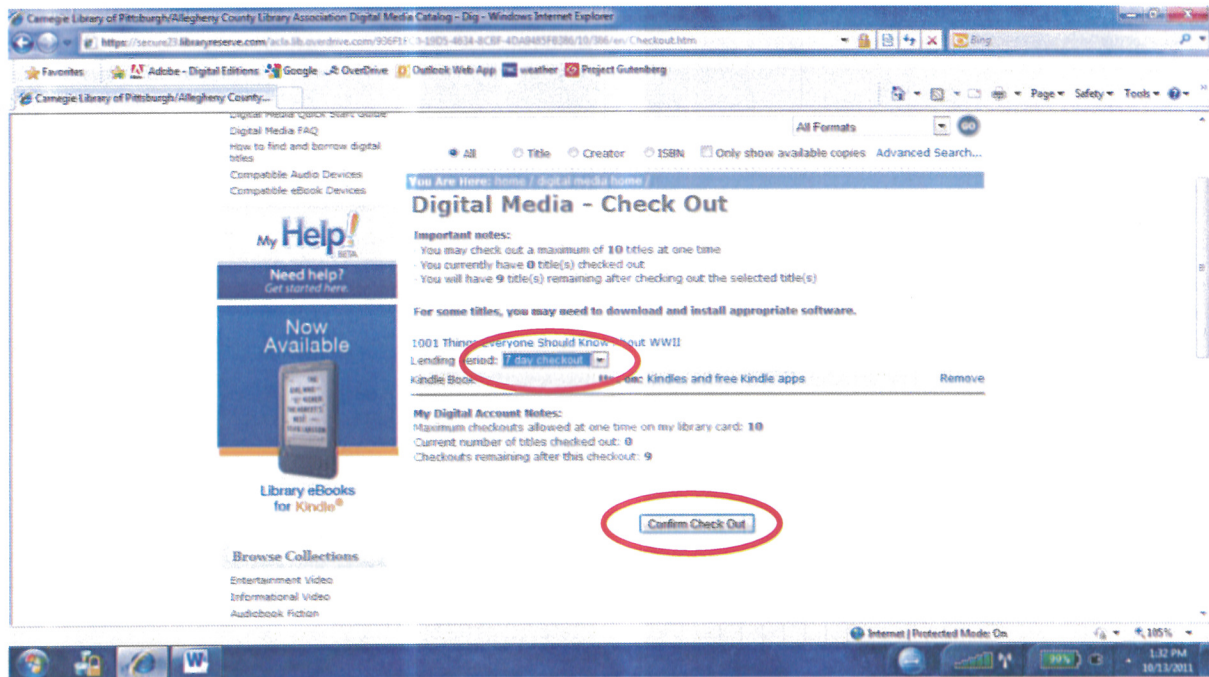
If this is the book that you want, click on the "Proceed to Checkout" link.



If you have not logged in already, you will be prompted to enter your library card number.



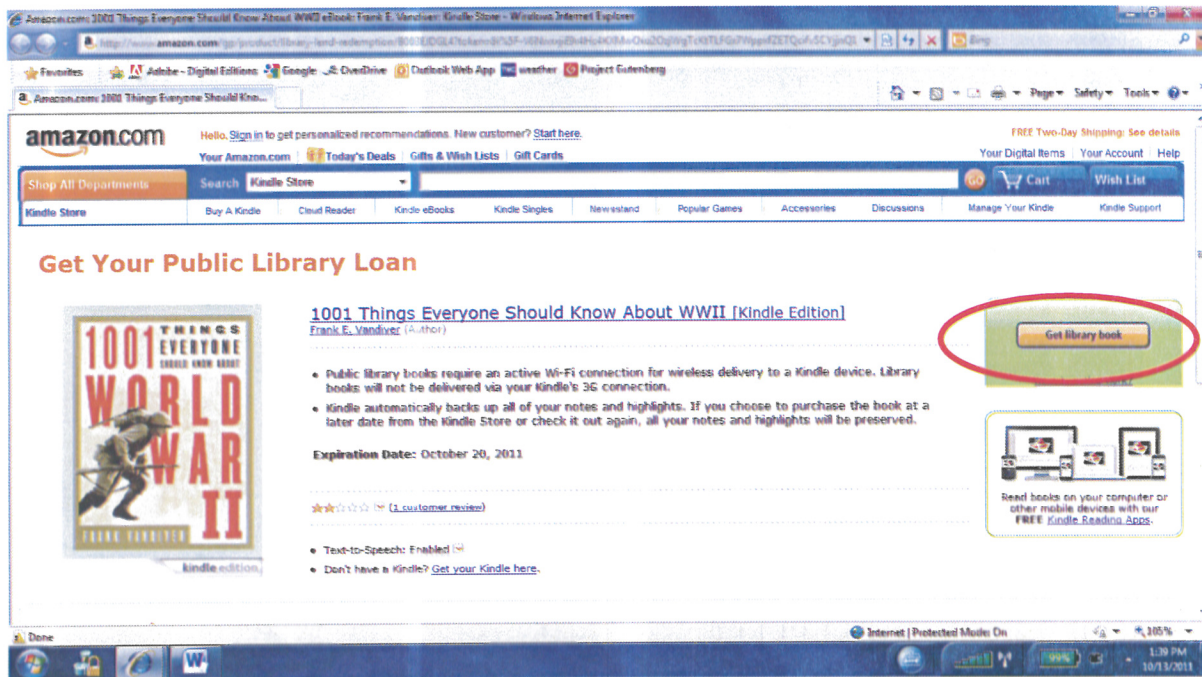
You will be taken to the “Digital Media – Check Out” screen. You can choose how long you want to borrow the book (7, 14, or 21 days) before you click the “Confirm Check Out” button.



The book is checked out to you. Click on the “Get for Kindle” button.




You will be taken to the Amazon website, where you will get your book. Click on the yellow “Get library book” button in the green rectangle on the right side of the page.



You will be asked to sign in to your Amazon account. Once you are logged in, you will be asked to choose which Kindle or Kindle App you want to use for your book. Choose your device and click “Continue.”

If your Kindle is not registered with Amazon, the following screen will appear. Select the “Register your device now” link near the bottom of the screen. (Alternately, if you do not have a Kindle, you can download a free Kindle app.)

On the next page, create a name for your Kindle and enter the serial number from your device. To find the serial number, press the Menu button on your Kindle and scroll to and select “Settings.”

Register your new Kindle to continue with your Kindle Edition purchase.


To register, give your Kindle a name and enter the 16 digit serial number for your device. For latest generation Kindle devices, you can find the serial number on the first page of the Settings screen on your device.

Once your Kindle (or Kindle app) is registered, you will see a screen that asks you how you want to have the book delivered. You can do this via a Wi-Fi connection (if available) or by connecting your Kindle to your computer with a USB cable.

**DOWNLOAD VIA WIFI:** If you are using a wireless connection, the book will be delivered to your chosen device or app and you will be taken to a confirmation screen. The next time you start your Kindle or your Kindle app, you should see it!

TIP: If you do not see your book, you can sync your device. This will prompt your Kindle to retrieve any books that are waiting for you. For information about syncing your Kindle please visit the Kindle help section on Amazon.

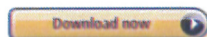


**DOWNLOAD VIA USB:** If you are using a USB cable, select the “Download now icon” to download the eBook to your computer.

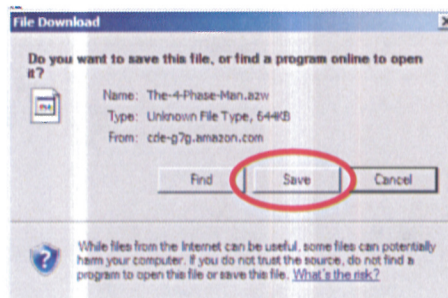

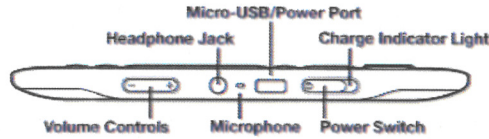
You can also send your book to other registered devices at [Manage Your Kindle](#) or read on other devices using our [Free Kindle Reading Apps](#).

When prompted choose Save. This should save the book to the default location on your computer.



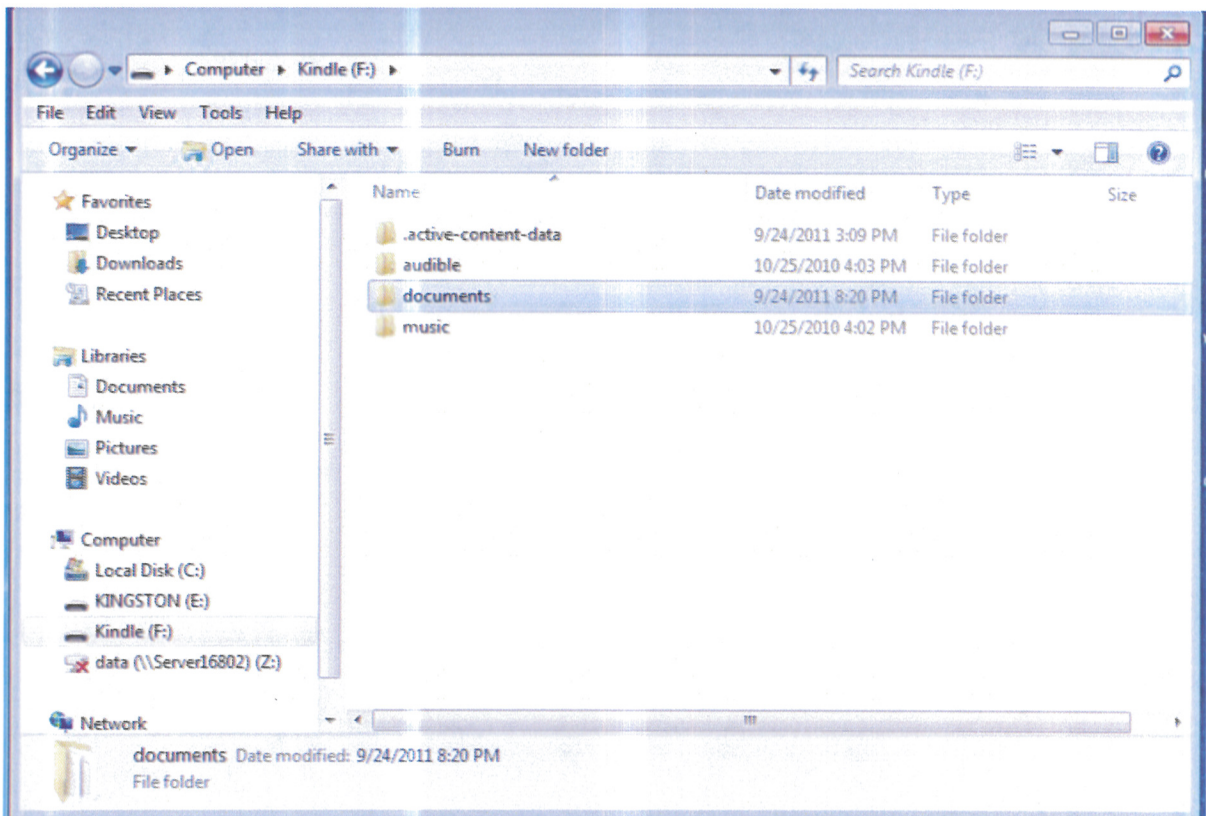
Connect your Kindle via its USB cable to your computer. You might need to wake up the Kindle by sliding the power button to the right. If this is the first time you have connected your Kindle to your computer, the Kindle

will install its drivers onto your computer. Make sure you wait until the drivers are installed before you continue.



Once you have attached the Kindle to your computer, you will see the following message on its screen: “If you want to read or shop on your Kindle while continuing to charge over USB, please keep the USB cable attached, but eject your Kindle from your computer.” Do not eject your Kindle from your computer until you have copied the eBook file from your computer to your Kindle.

Find the downloaded eBook file on your computer, and copy the downloaded file from your computer to the documents folder on your Kindle. The Kindle will be listed as a drive on your computer, and the documents folder appears once you open the Kindle.



This will transfer the eBook to your device. To read the book, you need to eject your Kindle from your computer. To do this, select “My Computer” from your desktop and right-click on the Kindle device listed under “Devices with removable storage.”

On the next menu, select “Eject” to safely remove the Kindle from your computer.
